Methods of Observing Young Children

Early Childhood Assessment Early childhood assessment is a tool used to gather and provide educators, parents, and families with critical information about a child's development and growth. In Massachusetts, licensed early childhood programs are now required to include a child assessment component in their programs.

Early Childhood Assessment: Resources for Early Learning

Observations are done using a tool called the Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS), which Pianta helped create in 2008. It's a tool that's been studied for decades in thousands of classrooms, and research has shown that it's linked to student gains in math, vocabulary and social skills.

The process of observing, recording, and documenting children's growth and behavior. Comes from the Latin word meaning to sit beside and get to know. To be an authentic assessment, observations must be done over time in play-based situations.
