Nietzsche thinks that “priestly” morality evolves from historically oppressed people around the birth of Christianity. Oppressed people resent their oppressors, so they “revolt” and develop a new moral code that depicts their own own humble, patient, and obedient behavior as “good” and demonizes people they hate (their oppressors) as barbaric, aggressive beasts of prey .
