Prevention Services Vision: OCFS prevention services seek to promote the health, well-being, and safety of children and families by reducing the risk and effects of adverse childhood experiences (such as neglect, trauma, or exposure to violence).

Currently, there are hundreds of self-help programs and approaches to diabetes prevention. It aims to correct the value-policy mismatch perpetuated by the former funding system, which incentivized foster care placement and did not provide funding for noncustodial and prevention services.
